CITIZENSHIP #4 - PUBLIC TESTIMONY

CIVIC APPROVAL PROCESS

- 1. A citizen or a group of citizens present a proposal to a civic body.
 - proposal an issue or project that someone wants considered. civic - about citizens.
 - *civic body* a governing institution.
- 2. Applicable regulations are reviewed. applicable - regarding the proposal. regulation - existing law and policy.
- 3. Public testimony is sought. testimony - written or verbal opinion from citizens.
- 4. The civic body deliberates and takes action. deliberate - discuss and debate about both proposal and testimony.
 - take action vote to approve, disapprove, or delay.

IMPORTANT PARTS OF PUBLIC TESTIMONY

- 1. Be respectful.
- Specifically address the issue.
 Clearly state your position.
- 4. Reference similar testimony if appropriate.
- 5. Recommend a certain action.
- 6. Stay within the time limit.
